SEASON PREVIEW



The North Park University football program, under new head coach Kyle Rooker, looks to compete in the always tough College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) this upcoming 2019 season. The Vikings return a handful of key players and will also look to a solid group of newcomers.

North Park's offense returns players with significant time in junior quarterback Grant Borsch, senior running back Woody Corey, senior tight end Na'im Smith, sophomore wide receiver Frank Mauigoa, sophomore wide receiver Brian Mena, and senior wide receiver Malik Powell.



GRANT BORSCH

Borsch started in all 10 games last season, completing 166 of 294 passes for 1,653 total yards, throwing for 14 touchdowns. The Walkerton, Ind. native threw for four touchdowns against Elmhurst College on November 3 and tossed 353 passing yards against WashU on September 29.

Corey, a go-to wide receiver for the 2018 Vikings, caught 24 passes for 203 yards last season. The Des Plaines, Ill. native picked up a pair of touchdowns in his junior campaign, adding a season-best 118 receiving yards against Anderson University on September 1.

Smith grabbed three passes for 81 total yards as a junior in 2018. The Wesley Chapel, Fla. native caught a season-long 70-yard touchdown pass against Carthage College on October 27.

After serving in the military during the 2018 football season, Mauigoa returns to the gridiron for his sophomore year. The Pago Pago, American Samoa native was a quarterback for the 2017 Vikings, marking a team-best 5.5 yards per carry and four rushing touchdowns.

Mena played in all 10 games as a wide receiver last season. The Wesley Chapel, Fla. native caught 19 passes for a total of 220 yards, averaging 11.6 yards per catch. He scored a touchdown against WashU on September 29 and had a season-high 55 receiving yards against Carthage on October 27.

Powell also became a go-to receiver for the Vikings in 2018. The Hollywood, Fla. native caught 15 passes for 181 total yards and scored a touchdown against Carthage College on October 27. He also grabbed a season-long 60-yard catch against Elmhurst on November 3.



GEORGE TAFUA, Jr.

Leading the NPU offensive line will be senior captain George Tafua, Jr., long snapper Seth Swanson, and junior Rush Asing.

Tafua was named a Second Team All-CCIW selection in 2018 after protecting a young Viking offense. The Pago Pago, American Samoa native became the first North Park offensive lineman to be named to the All-CCIW team since Kenny Pistorius in 2014.

Swanson has played in all 30 games in his three years as a Viking while Asing saw significant time on the O-line this past season.

Also returning for his senior year is kicker/punter Alex Santillan. The Oswego, Ill. native has been the team's kicker for the last three seasons, completing 44 PATs and 10 field goals in his career.

Defensively, the Vikings will miss graduated senior - and 2019 New Orleans Saints signee - David Simmons, Jr. However, a number of seasoned veteran defenders return for the 2019 season.



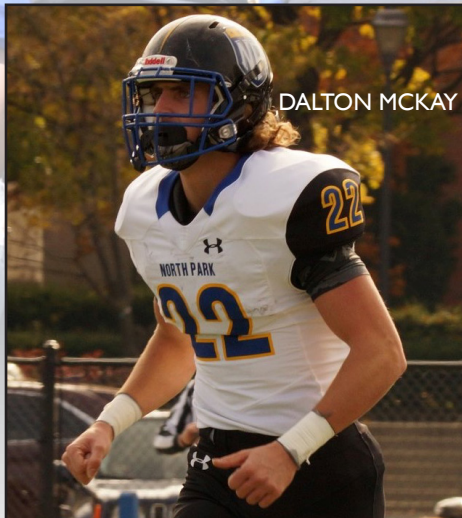
GARY ANISH

Senior captain Gary Anish enjoyed a breakout season in 2018, earning Second Team All-CCIW honors after leading the Viking defense with 77 total tackles (58 solo) and a CCIW 13th-best 64 tackles in league action. The Chicago, Ill. native picked off three passes against Anderson University on September 1, earning a spot on the D3football.com National Team of the Week.

Fellow senior captain Ryan Howson further strengthens the NPU defense. Howson, a native of Hoffman Estates, Ill., posted a team third-best five pass breakups and defended a team fourth-best six passes last season. The Viking defensive back also tallied 52 tackles (39 solo) and marked 2.5 tackles for a loss.



SEASON PREVIEW



DALTON MCKAY

Senior defensive back Dalton McKay was a turnover threat for the Vikings last season, leading the team with three interceptions. The Cedar Park, Tex. native also led the NPU defense in pass breakups (11) and passes defended (14). His season-long 20-yard interception arrived on September 15 against Millikin University.

Senior defensive lineman Uati Pati was a menace behind the line of scrimmage as a junior in 2018, leading the NPU defense in tackles for a loss (10), sacks (4), and forced fumbles (4). The Pago Pago, American Samoa native also added 34 tackles (23 solo), two pass breakups, two defended passes, and a quarterback hurry.

Senior defensive lineman Harold Alexander played in all ten games for North Park in 2018. The Chicago, Ill. native made 34 tackles (20 solo), 4.5 tackles for a loss, three sacks, and recovered a fumble.

Junior defensive back Tyrell Smith played in all 10 games for the Viking defense this past season. The West Palm Beach, Fla. native recorded a team second-best two forced fumbles and a team fifth-best 55 tackles (34 solo). He saw a season-best 11 tackles and forced fumble against WashU on September 29.

Sophomore linebacker Thomas Gaul saw some playing time as a freshman, picking up seven tackles, including four against Wheaton on October 6.

The Vikings also welcome a large number of transfers and freshmen that are expected to contribute right away.



HEAD COACH KYLE ROOKER

NPU football has seen a significant change in its coaching staff, as eight of nine coaches enter their first year with the Vikings.

During his six-year stint (2012-2018) as the assistant head coach and offensive coordinator of College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) familiar Carthage College, new Head Football Coach Kyle Rooker turned 2013's 1-9 outfit into a program that posted a record of 7-3 in consecutive seasons (2016 & 2017).

Working primarily with the offensive line, quarterbacks, and tight ends, Rooker directed an O-line that allowed the fewest sacks in the CCIW for the 2015 season (11), coached his quarterbacks to a combined 4:1 touchdown to interception ratio in 2016-2017, and helped lead his offense to the fewest turnovers in league action for the 2016 and 2017 seasons. The 2017 Carthage College team was the NCAA Division III leader in turnover margin.

In addition to his coaching responsibilities, Rooker was also the Red Men's academic coordinator. From 2013-2018, he helped improve the team's cumulative grade point average by .57 points while mentoring 2

CoSIDA Academic All-District selections.

Rooker, a native of Uniontown, Pennsylvania, graduated from The College of Wooster in 2001, earning his BA in History. While a part of the Fighting Scots' football team, Rooker was a 3-year varsity letterman, a 2-year varsity starter at linebacker, and a member of the 1997 NCAC championship team. He also holds a Master's degree in Leadership from Carthage College.

The Vikings will kick off the season on Saturday, September 7, when they travel to take on Anderson University. Kickoff is set for 6 p.m. CST.

The 2019 season will be the first at the helm for head coach Kyle Rooker.

A proven winner, Rooker advanced through a national search that included candidates from across the CCIW conference, the Midwest and the nation. Long-time Director of Athletics, Dr. Jack Surridge, stated:

"In a process that began with 117 applicants, Coach Rooker rose to the top. We are all convinced that his plan, 'all in' commitment, and mission fit will elevate the Viking football program to new heights."

During his six-year stint (2012-2018) as the assistant head coach and offensive coordinator of College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) familiar Carthage College, Rooker turned 2013's 1-9 outfit into a program that posted a record of 7-3 in consecutive seasons (2016 & 2017).

Working primarily with the offensive line, quarterbacks, and tight ends, Rooker directed an O-line that allowed the fewest sacks in the CCIW for the 2015 season (11), coached his quarterbacks to a combined 4:1 touchdown to interception ratio in 2016-2017, and helped lead his offense to the fewest turnovers in league action for the 2016 and 2017 seasons. The 2017 Carthage College team was the NCAA Division III leader in turnover margin.

In addition to his coaching responsibilities, Rooker was also the Red Men's academic coordinator. From 2013-2018, he helped improve the team's cumulative grade point average by .57 points while mentoring 2 CoSIDA Academic All-District selections.

Prior to his time at Carthage College, Rooker was the offensive, defensive, special teams, and recruiting coordinator of his alma mater, The College of Wooster (OH) from July 2001 until December 2012.

The 2004 Fighting Scots posted the best finish in school history at 11-1, captured a North Coast Athletic Conference (NCAC) championship, and finalized their season with a national ranking of 10th in NCAA Division III football.

Rooker, a native of Uniontown, Pennsylvania, graduated from The College of Wooster in 2001, earning his BA in History. While a part of the Fighting Scots' football team, Rooker was a 3-year varsity letterman, a 2-year varsity starter at linebacker, and a member of the 1997 NCAC championship team. He also holds a Master's degree in Leadership from Carthage College.

Coach Rooker's family includes his wife Jennifer, and his daughters Piper (6) and Kendall (1).

As a student-athlete at Campbellsville University, Alcorn earned a degree in criminal justice and enjoyed a successful football career.

Alcorn was a two-time First Team All-NAIA Mid-South Conference honoree and a two-time First Team All-NCCAA selection. He was also awarded the Mid-South Conference Offensive Player of the Year in 2016.

In three seasons at Campbellsville, Alcorn caught 121 receptions for 2,103 yards (17.4 yards per reception) with 36 touchdowns in 26 games. Alcorn holds the school's all-time mark in TD receptions (36) and the single-season TD reception record with 19 which he set during the 2015 season.
